

Student's Code of Conduct and Discipline

Being component of a Quasiquicentennial Institution (1892-2017) instils a sense of pride in all the students of Meerut College, Meerut. They are supposed to devote their time in academics, co-curricular activities as well as in sports activities. Keeping in view the highest traditions of our academic culture they are required to prove to be an example to their seniors, peers and juniors being an asset for the institution, society as well as country. Meerut College, Meerut expects from its all bonafide students to observe the highest standards of disciplinary standards as well as attendance regulations as per UGC norms and State Government rules and directives. It is mandatory for all the bonafide students of Meerut College, Meerut to abide by the Students' Code of Conduct.

The Code of Conduct is as follows

1. All the bonafide students shall carry their Identity Cards with them while in the Campus and are also suggested to keep it outside the Campus as well. Whenever any College Authority asks for I card they must present the same.
2. All I Cards issued are non-transferable and so if a student ceases to be on its roll or takes transfer he/she should immediately surrender his/her I card to Proctor Office.
3. In view of the Hon'ble Supreme Court's orders Dt. 16.05.2007, 11.02.2009 and G.O. No. - 746/70-1-2009, Lucknow Dt. 20.03.2009 all the students while seeking admission are required to submit a duly signed affidavit along with the signature of the Parent/Guardian to not to get involved in any act falling under the purview of Ragging. If found guilty under any such activity, the student will be liable to punishment as per the provisions laid down.
4. Use of drugs in any harmful form / smoking / bullying/carrying of arms /vandalism /loitering are not permissible within Campus. All such cases are liable to punishment.
5. All cases of indiscipline are monitored by the Proctorial board comprising of Chief Proctor and a body of Proctors. Principal takes all the disciplinary actions in consultation with the Proctorial Board.

6. College Maintains a Black-List of those students who are found guilty of misconduct or grave breach of discipline. It is strictly adhered to at the time of admission to various regular courses and Students' Union Election etc.
7. The park in front of D.S.W's office is reserved only for girls and the boys are not allowed to enter the same.
8. All the facilities e.g. parking/drinking water/washrooms/library/laboratories/parks can be used by all its bonafide students.
9. No outsiders besides the ones identified by the college as guest, visitor, parent, guardian or alumni or any other person with a valid purpose to visit the college campus, are allowed in its premises.

Punishment for Misconduct/Breach of Code of Conduct

1. If a student is found guilty of grave misconduct or indiscipline or ragging or holding of introduction or any other practice adopted to harass other students within the premises of the College or Hostel, the Principal, the Chief Proctor may punish him/her as per the provisions laid down in Act and Statutes / Code of Conduct.
2. The Chief Proctor shall have the power to recommend suspension of a student temporarily from the College pending any enquiry or alleged misconduct. However, before inflicting a punishment on the student an opportunity of personal hearing shall be given to him/her.
3. If the Principal is satisfied that a student is guilty of grave misconduct or breach of discipline causing harassment to any authority, teacher, student or employee of the College or of causing destruction to College property, or any other act falling under such category; he may punish him as per provisions laid down in Act and Statutes.

Proctorial Board

The Proctorial Board consisting of a Chief Proctor and a body of Proctors (faculty members) assists the Principal in exercising of his disciplinary authority. The Proctorial Board after due verification of the college fees/ dues/ admission requirements etc. Issues the Identity Cards to the bonafide students of the College. Identity Cards are issued on the advice/recommendation of the admission authorities. Application form for admission is available in the College Prospectus and the students are required to complete all the formalities to obtain the Identity Cards within 15 days of their admission/readmission to the College.

The Chief Proctor

The Chief Proctor assists the Principal in the exercise of his disciplinary authority. He also exercises all such administrative powers and duties in respect of discipline as are assigned to him by the Principal. The Chief Proctor is assisted by a Board of Proctors.
